
Diocesan Know Love & Serve Assembly October 9th and 10th

Dear Friends,

One of the best things about now being pastor of Sacred Heart is the Sunday celebrations of the Eucharist. I am very impressed by the fine balance of "humanity" and "solemnity" that is part of our weekly



liturgy, both Saturday evenings and Sunday mornings. The congregational singing is lovely. And I am most especially just impressed by the committed service of so many to the various ministries of the liturgy: lectors, Eucharistic ministers, servers, choirs, and more.

With the coming of a new pastor, inevitably, some changes come with him. Together with our deacon, Brian, and our Liturgy Committee, I have been considering some adaptations in some aspects of how we celebrate Mass at Sacred Heart; most of them are practical, "how to" kinds of things, like the procession at the beginning of each Mass, or how we distribute Holy Communion.

Rather than make changes in a piecemeal fashion and risk not having our many liturgical ministers on board all at the same time, I prefer to gather everyone involved in the liturgy for a workshop where we can all learn about the liturgy, explain the changes we are planning, and as well as walk through those changes.

We would like as many of our lectors, musicians, EM's, servers, greeters, and others who have a role in the Mass to join us for this worship workshop so have settled on a day and time that we think will work for most: Sunday, October 11th, following coffee and doughnuts after the 10:00 am Mass.

We are always in need of new liturgical ministers so if you would like to serve your parish in this way, please join us and we will make sure you are well prepared.

I am so grateful to all who already do so much to make our Sunday celebrations of the Word and the Eucharist so beautiful and spiritually rich!
