Haiti Relief

Hurricane Matthew, a powerful category 4 storm, made landfall on Haiti early Tuesday, October 4, 2016. With as many as 900 killed and tens of thousands of homes destroyed in Haiti, the devastation caused by Hurricane Matthew is becoming more clear as officials and aid workers are starting to reach remote areas.



Outside of immediate food, the greatest needs will be shelter, water and hygiene supplies. Along with partners, **Catholic Relief Services** is now responding in some of the most affected areas in southern Haiti. CRS will distribute blankets, kitchen and hygiene kits and other emergency supplies as needed, as well as monitor potential outbreaks of cholera and other diseases. CRS is distributing hygiene kits, including soap, buckets, toothbrushes, as well as kitchen utensils and blankets.

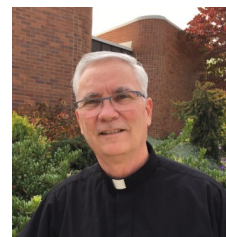

A Word from Father...



Dear Friends:

I am SO OVER this election!

Just think, in two more days, no more blistering TV ads, no more "October Surprises", no more empty-headed commentary by the yakking heads on CNN, FOX, and MSNBC! No more being ever-so-careful with whom we share our political preferences for fear of that terrible look of disgust and disdain that has been so common this time around!

I've been voting since I was 18 and have seldom missed even a local election, but none has ever been as hard to endure as that to which we have been subjected this past year. I am so sorry for our country that our noble democratic traditions have devolved to almost no discussion of the great issues of the day and more angry snarling than anyone should have to absorb. Enough already! And to quote Shakespeare, "A pox on both your houses!"

Well, now that I've got that off my chest...on second thought:

NO! I cannot be "so over" this election *until* I have voted! Unmatched toxicity levels notwithstanding, I cannot divest myself of the **MORAL** responsibility to study, prepare, and cast a well-informed ballot on Tuesday. I say a "moral responsibility" because it IS exactly that! Our long history of Catholic social teaching makes it clear that each of us as individuals and all of us as a community have the power to form society through our witness in word and deed to our Christian values...and through our vote. If we should choose not to exert whatever force we have, (no matter how small it may feel) through our participation in this democracy then we have failed one another, and failed our country, and failed our consciences.

Our U. S. bishops, as they do every four years, have issued a very helpful document on precisely this responsibility to both form our political conscience well and to exercise that well-formed conscience by voting; it is titled, *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, (available on the bishops' website: www.usccb.org). It is worth a few minutes of your time to look it over. It stands out from the blathering commentators and dueling candidates as a careful and well-considered voice in the midst of much hubbub. One simple paragraph gives you a sense of its clarity:

In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation. "People in every nation enhance the social dimension of their lives by acting as committed and responsible citizens" (Evangelii Gaudium, no. 220). The obligation to participate in political life is rooted in our baptismal commitment to follow Jesus Christ and to bear Christian witness in all we do. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person."
