A Word from Father...



Dear Friends:

What a great weekend I had in Pullman!

As you may know, I was reassigned to Sacred Heart Parish from St. Thomas More Newman Center in early June, long after most of the Catholic students who I pastored there for five years had left town for their summer break; we didn't have an opportunity for a proper farewell and that felt, both to me and, I believe, to them, as something left incomplete. As one of the students wrote me last summer, "We have a Father Kevin—size hole in our hearts." So going back to Pullman, WSU, and most of all, to St. Thomas More was really an opportunity to bring closure to my ministry there in a very personal and warm way.

My days there were everything I could have hoped for and more! Attending the big game against Stanford was a lot of fun, for sure, but it was really not nearly as significant as the opportunity to celebrate the three Sunday masses at the Newman Center (two in English, one in Spanish) as well as attend the Friday Night Dinner (Halloween-themed, of course). I was able to visit with "my kids" at some length and catch up with them on the latest chapters in their studies and prospects for employment in their favored careers. More than that, I was able to let them know how much I have missed them and that leaving them was much more difficult than I ever expected. Likewise, they were able to say how much they missed me (even as they love their new pastor, Father Luke), and how happy they were to have me back, if even just for a weekend. Some of the student-leaders who had been my chief co-workers over the last few years presented me with a hard-bound photo book filled with pictures from across the last five years accompanied by their messages of appreciation and well-wishes for me in my new ministry here among you.

Leaving a parish is always a little bit painful because we as pastors grow to know and love the people we serve and we become a kind of family. This is even more true in leaving Newman ministry because they are so young and come to trust their pastor so much. Coming to a new parish is always an adventure of the heart, too, as new relationships are built and a new family forms. Coming back to Sacred Heart this week after my days in Pullman remind me of just how much all of you are coming to mean to me. In the months and years to come, may we continue to grow in friendship, faith, service, and grace one another greatly. As I was so blessed to be pastor of our Catholic Cougs in Pullman, so now I am so blessed to be pastor of our Catholics family at Sacred Heart!

Thank you for your welcome, your warmth, and your confidence in me these first few months together. Let us continue to pray for one another!
