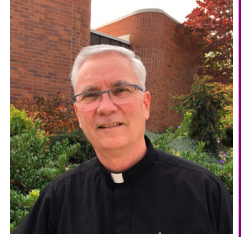

A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

As many of you well know, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th was the day Pope Francis chose to open the Holy Year on Mercy. As he opened the Holy Year Door at St. Peter's in Rome, this was his prayer and is worthy of our attention in these late days of the Advent season. There is no greater sign of God's mercy than that of the Incarnation, God becoming flesh with us and showing to us his face even as he reveals to us his heart.

May Pope Francis' prayer be our prayer, too, in these Advent days and those of Christmas to come...

*O God,
who reveal your omnipotence above all in mercy and forgiveness,
grant that we might live a year of grace,

in the joy of the Gospel.*
