ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL 2016

At the present time the Annual Catholic Appeal 2016 is being conducted in all 82 parishes and missions in the Diocese of Spokane. The goal for our parish is **\$53,674**. Our first report indicates that **6** of our 278 parish households have responded with a total of **\$1,865**. (Due to complications at the Diocesan level, all contributions have not yet been reported to us.) A most appreciative "Thank you!" to those who have contributed so far to this year's Appeal, especially since the pledge envelopes arrived in the mail late in the week. May each of the remaining households respond generously to Bishop Daly's appeal for participation in the Annual Catholic Appeal 2016. The success of this year's Appeal is critical to carrying out the mission of the Church.

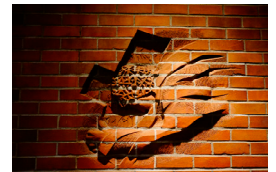

The name of this Mass comes from the Sacred Chrism which is one of the oils to be blessed and then distributed throughout the diocese for celebrations of Baptism and Confirmation. The other oils to be blessed are the Oil of the Sick And the Oil of Catechumens. All are welcome to attend.

A Word from Father...

Dear Friends,

I came across a lovely Lenten reading in the *Liturgy of Hours* that is worth sharing, at least in part; it is from a homily by the 4th century archbishop of Constantinople, St. John Chrysostom:



Prayer and converse with God is a supreme good: it is a partnership and union with God. As the eyes of the body are enlightened what they see light, so our spirit, when it is intent on God, is illumined by his finite light. I do not mean the prayer of outward observance but prayer from the heart, not confide to fixed times or period but continuous throughout the day and night. ...

Prayer is the light of the spirit, true knowledge of God, mediating between God and man. The spirit, raised up to heaven by prayer, clings to God with the utmost tenderness; like a child crying tearfully for its mother, it craves the mild that God provides. It seeks the satisfaction of its own desires, and receives gifts outweighing the whole world of nature.

Payer stands before God as an honored ambassador. It gives joy to the spirit, peace to the heart. I speak of prayer, not words. It is the longing for God, love too deep for words, a gift not given by man but by God's grace.

When the Lord gives this kind of prayer to a man, he gives him riches that cannot be taken away, heavenly food that satisfies the spirit. One who tastes this food is set on fire with an eternal longing for the Lord: his spirit burns as in a fire of the utmost intensity.

Practice prayer from the beginning. Paint your house with the colors of modesty and humility. Make it radiant with the light of justice. Decorate it with the finest gold leave of good deeds. Adorn it with the walls and stones of faith and generosity. Crown it with the pinnacle of prayer. In this way you will make it a perfect dwelling place for the Lord. You will be able to receive him as in a splendid palace, and through his grace you will already possess him, his image enthroned in the temple of your spirit.
