A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

I write to you from the East Coast as I enjoy a few days "hangin' with my bro's," Actually, I am with my brothers, Lou has lived in South Carolina for a long time, and since this past summer, Paul lives in North Carolina. Every year all of us get together for a few days of skiing, hiking, hot-tubbing, teasing, talking, catching up, etc. (let's not go into the details of that "etc."!). We usually do that at Silver Mountain, 49 N, or Schweitzer, but with two of us now in the Carolinas, we decided us Westsiders would give them a break by us travelling to them. My oldest brother, Phil, died suddenly a couple years back so we always toast him over dinner at least once during the week, and even more, think of him and feel his absence just about every day. In our talk, we steer clear of politics and religion and succeed most of the time, though chatting about Pope Francis is always a winner. This year may be a particular challenge to keep away from the more divisive stuff with a presidential campaign well under way; some of us listen to Rush while others among us tend to NPR. Perhaps what we can agree on by way of politics is that this year's campaign is particularly disagreeable. The disrespect that seems now to be the new normal is not worthy of us as a people or a nation. I'll stop there, though I, for one, would like nothing better than to spend the next seven months on a desert island and come back just in time to vote.

Now that the topic has come up, might I suggest that rather than ignoring their sometimes degrading comportment as candidates, a more helpful response to our present political climate might be to pray for these folks? I suppose any one of them could win the presidency if circumstances were to play out in one way or another; voters are fickle and easily swayed by current events and the bombast of political advertising. Whether we love or detest one or other of them, any one of them could be standing on that podium in front of the capital in January. The welfare of our country and our world will rest quite squarely on that person's shoulders for at least four years, if not eight. Pray that all of them take that responsibility seriously, prepare themselves well to carry it with strength and courage, not to mention wisdom, and that the good of the weak and vulnerable always be at the top of their agenda. I, for one, would like to nominate Pope Francis, but he already has a job elsewhere.

Enjoy spring. Delight in Easter. Sing heartily our reborn Alleluias. See you in a couple of weeks.
