A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

On this Solemn Feast of the Holy Trinity, my old catechism from grade school comes to mind. Within its pages was a diagram of the Holy Trinity that was meant to aid us little Catholic kids in understanding this foundational mystery of our faith. It looked something very much like this:



I remember liking the two angels up in the corners, but the rest of it left me a bit confused. It was maybe too full of what seemed then to be math equations and geometric angles for me to get into the diagram itself...all those triangles, circles, and "is" and "is not's"! It was just too

much for my kind of non-computational brain!

I must admit, it was kind of clever and I could see how some kids might find it helpful, but I was not among them. When it came to the mysteries of faith, I was more into stories as my preferred means of explanation. I loved the story of St. Augustine that went something like this:

Augustine was walking by the seashore one day contemplating and trying to understand the mystery of the Holy Trinity when he saw a small boy running back and forth from the water to a spot on the seashore. The boy was using a sea shell to carry the water from the ocean and place it into a small hole in the sand.

Augustine approached him and asked, "My boy, what are doing?"

"I am trying to bring all the sea into this hole," the boy replied. "But that is impossible, my dear child, the hole cannot contain all that water."

The boy paused in his work, stood up, looked into the eyes of the Saint, and replied, "It is no more impossible than what you are trying to do – comprehend the immensity of the mystery of the Holy Trinity with your small intelligence."

I also liked how one of our Franciscan sisters explained it to us: "The Trinity is like a three-sided diamond...one stone, three faces, through the faces the colors of the rainbow brighten our lives!" (The rainbow colors being grace, I suppose. I also wondered if there was such a thing as a diamond with just three sides, but no matter).

And when all is said and done, the truth is what remains: In God's goodness we are blessed by his love as a Father who creates us, a brother who walks with us, a Spirit who enlivens us.
