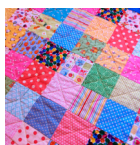

## Novena and Canonization Mass in honor of Blessed Teresa of Calcutta

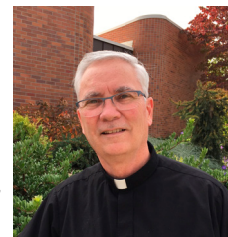
Join the Missionaries of Charity in celebrating the life and sanctity of Blessed Teresa of Calcutta!

## A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

Another Fourth of July has come and gone. This great feast of the American summer is for many of us the "high point" of the summer season. Whether we go out to the lake for a long weekend of skiing, swimming, and campfires on the beach, or just stay at home for burgers and franks in the back yard (followed by PBS' broadcast of the fireworks in Washington, DC?), the day and the weekend that unfolds it, are important to us, not just because of the fun that comes with it, but far more for the values that motivated our Founding Fathers to lead us to independence as a nation. We know those values well; they are enshrined in our Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, and a whole host of patriotic hymns and anthems. The words, "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness," among many others, ring in our collective American hearts as the hallmarks of all that is best in our nation.

Last Sunday, we sang a lovely hymn at the end of Mass that is not usually associated with our Independence Day, but which proclaims our value with an eye wisely cast beyond our borders. The melody is by the Finnish composer, Jean Sibelius and is called "Finlandia;" the English translation of the hymn is called, "This is My Song." In just three simple verses, it captures a more universal vision of our hopes and dreams:

*This is my song, O God of all the nations,  
A song of peace for lands afar and mine.  
This is my home, the country where my heart is;  
Here are my hopes, my dreams, my holy shrine;  
But other hearts in other lands are beating  
With hopes and dream as true and high as mine.*

*My country's skies are bluer than the ocean,  
And sunlight beams on clover leaf and pine.  
But other lands have sunlight too, and clover,  
And skies are everywhere as blue as mine.  
So hear my song, O God of all the nations,  
A song of peace for their land and for mine.*

*This is my prayer, O God of all the earth's kingdoms,  
Your kingdom come; on earth your will be done.  
Let Christ be lifted up till all shall serve him,  
And hearts united learn to live as one.  
So hear my prayer, O God of all the nations.  
Myself I give you; let your will be done.*

As we continue to enjoy these summer weeks, let us not forget to pray for our nation and every nation, "a song of peace for their land and for mine."
