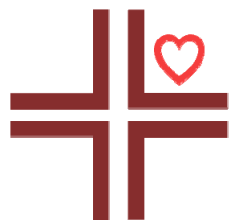

A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

It may come as a surprise to some, but most of you know that Sacred Heart Parish, as with all the parishes of our diocese, is a corporation of the non-profit type. One of the requirements of being a corporation is that the State of Washington requires that we have a corporate board meeting once a year, and for most of us, that happens in the month of October. Our board members are Fr. Paul Heric (assigned by the bishop), Kevin Jones, the chair of our Finance Council, and myself. In advance of our upcoming meeting, Nancy Kleweno has been working hard on getting our various reports and documents in order...a fairly complicated and time-consuming task. Spreadsheets and financial reports are not cheery bedtime reading for me, generally speaking, but one of the many reports she has prepared for us is particularly encouraging: our *Income-Expense Report* for the past fiscal year (July 2016-June 2016). It cheers me because it shows two important things for a pastor and for our parishioners:

One: In response to our appeal to you last fall to increase your sacrificial giving to the parish, you have done so in a remarkable way. The previous year (2014-15), you donated in envelopes and plate a total of \$268,373. This past year (2015-16) your donations increased to \$288,657. That is an *increase* of \$20,284 over the previous year! What can a pastor say, but a hearty *THANK YOU* to you all for your generosity to your parish!

Two: On the expense side, it is a little more complicated to find just the right numbers to show how we are doing because of accounting technicalities like "Fixed Capital Assets", whatever that may be! But even with those complications, a simple comparison of our bottom line on the expense side shows we also are doing a good job of managing well our financial resources. Last year's total expense line reads \$315,498, but this past year's total expense line reads \$310,090...that is \$5,408 less money expended than the previous year.

Kevin Jones will be soon be giving you a more full report that you can take to bed with you for some casual reading (guaranteed to put you to sleep!). I just wanted you to know how pleased I am that our "numbers" are looking so good. All in all, one less thing for the pastor to stress about!

Looking ahead, our positive finances now will help us greatly in the years to come as we face some major capital improvements, the biggest being the ancient heating system in the church; for now it is working, but it is old and not retrofit-able for air conditioning. One of these years its going to gasp its last breath and go cold on us (hopefully not on Christmas Eve!).

Many thanks to our parish Finance Council members, Kevin Jones, Mike Phalen, Dennis Felgenhauer, Lisa Simpson, and to Nancy Kleweno in the front office for all they do to keep our parish ship afloat!
