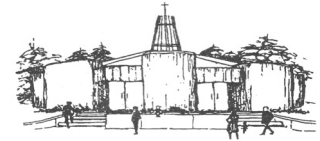

Haiti Relief

Hurricane Matthew, a powerful category 4 storm, made landfall on Haiti early Tuesday, October 4, 2016. With as many as 900 killed and tens of thousands of homes destroyed in Haiti, the devastation caused by Hurricane Matthew is becoming more clear as officials and aid workers are starting to reach remote areas.



Outside of immediate food, the greatest needs will be shelter, water and hygiene supplies. Along with partners, **Catholic Relief Services** is now responding in some of the most affected areas in southern Haiti. CRS will distribute blankets, kitchen and hygiene kits and other emergency supplies as needed, as well as monitor potential outbreaks of cholera and other diseases. CRS is distributing hygiene kits, including soap, buckets, toothbrushes, as well as kitchen utensils and blankets.

Disciples in Dialogue Adult Faith Enrichment St. Augustine Parish

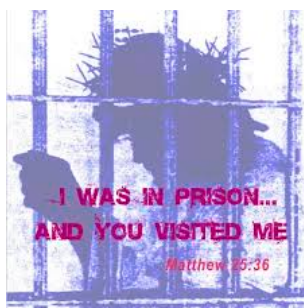

A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

There has been a movement afoot over the past several years to empty Halloween of all its fun. Sadly, those promoting the decommissioning of this mid-autumn feast are usually well intentioned Christians who find the night's focus on goblins, ghosts, witches, and skeletal personages prowling the darkened streets contrary to the Christian faith...at least as they understand it...if not somewhat satanic and diabolical. In place of Trick or Treating, special parties are held on the night of the 31st that are cleansed of all such elements yet give the kids a "safe" place to gather and have fun.

Well, I come from a very Halloweeny kind of family and I don't roll with the Halloween-spoilers. We kids loved Trick or Treating and came home at the end of a long night with paper grocery bags overflowing with Snickers, O Henrys, Hershey bars, and the occasional orange. Having also come from a very Catholic kind of family, we found congruence between our faith and the fun to be had on that final night of October. Unlike some of today's hyper-vigilant Christians, always on the lookout for signs of Satan in our culture, we Catholics saw the whole thing not as a celebration of Evil, but as a celebration of the Lord's VICTORY over Evil. By dressing up as ghouls we were making fun of them and showing them to be powerless in the wake of Jesus' Resurrection. We knew that the feast we were really celebrating was All Hallows' Eve, the heavenly victory of a million saints in their earthly struggles over the powers of death and despair. The candy collected and then sparingly shared out through the coming month was a mostly-unconscious, but nevertheless real reminder of the blessings of heaven now being enjoyed by our saintly sisters and brothers, and those we would enjoy once our own journey on this earth was complete. For us as Catholics, All Saints and All Souls Days are little Easters...days in which we celebrate the sharing of the Resurrection with our sisters and brothers who have gone before us.

I wish you all very happy All Hallows Eve and All Souls Day...now I have to get my costume pulled together and get busy Trick or Treating!
