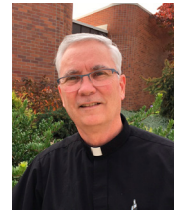

## A Word from Father...

Dear Friends,

As I announced at our parish Masses last weekend, Bishop Daly has decided to make a significant change in the governance structure at Cataldo Catholic School.



About seven years ago, a Board of Directors consisting of school parents or of those who recently had students at Cataldo was formed and according to the by-laws that were established at the time, this new Board of Directors became the governing body of the school and its legal corporation. To preserve some aspect of the previous parochial leadership, one of the pastors was given a voting membership on the Board, while the other two were non-voting *ex-officio* members. In effect, the non-voting pastors delegated their authority to the voting "Pastor-Director." The pastors, in effect, then had one vote out of twelve on any matter concerning the school's direction, financing, mission, evaluation, planning, and many other areas. The pastors also have met with the principal/head of school monthly to discuss concerns and to be kept abreast of developments at the school.

The Board of Directors over these past seven years has worked very hard to make Cataldo a wonderful school for the children it serves. I have been the "Pastor-Director" on the Board since September and have witnessed the passion and dedication of the Board members in action.

Nevertheless, Bishop Daly became concerned that this governance model was far less parish based than any other elementary school in the Diocese and most other Catholic elementary schools around the country; he felt the present structure risked Cataldo becoming more and more a *private* school and less and less a *parochial* school. He told Fathers Connall, Dublinsky, and myself that he wanted the school to return to a governance model that placed the parish pastors in the role of the Board of Directors, overseeing the mission and priorities of the school, evaluating the effectiveness of its programs and administration, and guaranteeing both the Catholic identity of the school and its foundation in the life of the three sponsoring parishes.

In his letter to the present Board, delivered to them on March 16th, he also made it clear that he expected new councils and committees be formed to guarantee that the voice of parents and staff of the school find their rightful place in the life of the school.

Fathers Dublinsky, Connall, and I will be working diligently along with Head of School, Dr. Mark Selle, and the current Board members to bring Bishop Daly's vision for Cataldo to fruition in the months to come.

As always, if you have concerns about Cataldo or its leadership, please know that I am always most willing and grateful for the opportunity to meet with you.

Cataldo is a wonderful school and I believe it will continue to grow in fulfilling its mission of an excellent place for our children to grow in faith and knowledge.
