A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

And so it begins...

Holy Week commences, as you well know, with the commemoration of the Lord's Entry into Jerusalem, the Palm Procession followed by the proclamation of the Lord's Passion and Death in the Liturgy of the Word and the Eucharist, all of which we have just celebrated. And so our most holy week of the year as Christians begins its inexorable movement forward to its culmination in Jesus' Resurrection on the First Day of the Week.



These holy days between now and Easter are specially tuned to assist us in immersing our whole selves into the extraordinary events of Jesus' last days so that we might rejoice as deeply as possible in his Resurrection. Besides personal prayer throughout the week and the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation together on Tuesday evening, the Church also calls us to gather on each night of

the Holy Triduum to solemnly pass with the Lord from death to life.

The Holy Triduum begins on Thursday evening with the commemoration of the Lord's Last Supper. It is marked by the beautiful ritual of the "Mandatum", or the "Washing of Feet" and followed by prayerful adoration of the Eucharist in the church vestibule until 10:00 pm. There is no final blessing at the end of the Holy Thursday Eucharist since we will have begun a single liturgy that passes across three nights. We will pick up on Friday night where we left off on Thursday with no formal entrance procession as we quietly continue with the Commemoration of the Lord's Passion. The Gospel account of the Lord's Passion and Death is proclaimed, followed by the powerful rite of the Veneration of the Cross, and the distribution of Holy Communion. Finally, on Saturday night, we gather again outside the church for the blessing of the Holy Fire and the Easter Candle and quietly move into the church for the extended Liturgy of the Word in which the story of our God's loving salvation is told from the creation of the world through the Exodus followed by the Prophets. Following the homily, those to be welcomed into the Catholic Church will make their profession of faith, be confirmed, and participate in the Eucharist as full members of the Church for the first time. The three nights end with glorious *All ___ias* resounding!

To participate in the Holy Triduum is one of the great experiences of our faith and it profoundly prepares us for the reality of New Life that comes to us through Jesus, broken unto death and risen unto divine life. May I urge you to do all in your power to join us for the Holy Triduum this coming week! You will not regret whatever sacrifices you make to travel with the Lord and his Church this most wondrous spiritual pilgrimage available to us just once a year!
