A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

As you know, the week following Easter Sunday, I took a little break, spending a couple of days visiting my good friend, Father Pedro Bautista, in his parish in Brewster.

Brewster, as you may know, is located in the Okanogan Valley, along the banks of the Columbia River, about thirty miles north of Chelan. Brewster's Sacred Heart Parish was my first pastorate and I have many happy memories from my five years there as a very young priest (black hair then!). In some ways, not much has changed. The sage and pine hills on either side of the river are exactly as they were. The river flows slow and steady as it always has, (well, at least since the dams went in), and the town itself looks very much like it did when I was there thirty years ago, even the aging mobile homes that dot the town are as they were. But in other ways, the place is much different now. The shops and restaurants along main street, once all signed in English are now almost exclusively signed in Spanish. The businesses cater to the Spanish speaking residents who are clearly now the majority of the town's population.

When I started in Brewster, there was just one Mass on Sunday...in English. We later transitioned to one bilingual Mass, then still later, one English and one Spanish. Those transitions were not easy and it was a tough change for many. All these years later, it is a different story: the parish has two Masses in Spanish, both standing-room-only, and one in English, which has as many Spanish-speakers in the pews as English...just not enough room in the church for everyone at the Spanish Masses!

The pastoral demands on the pastor are much as they were, just greater now. Father Pedro still goes out to the labor camps (small cabins lined up in long rows along dusty roads), to say Mass for the fieldworkers who can't get into town for church...he just does a lot more of it now than I ever did. He has over eighty kids in religious education every week and many more in his youth group. Cursillo ministry abounds, too.

The parish center we helped fund with our donations last fall is now up, though not quite complete. It will be a huge help to Father in tending to the needs of his parish, young and old.

As I left the valley on Wednesday and headed home, I felt proud of what I had a hand in beginning in Brewster thirty years ago and even more proud of Father Pedro for the great ministry he shares with the Catholic community in Brewster now.
