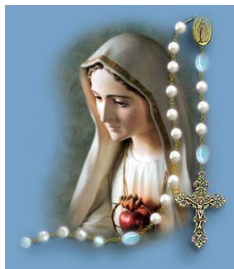

## A Word from Father



Dear Friends,

On this great feast of Pentecost, I am happily reminded of the most "Spirit-filled" person I have ever known.

Her name is Helen and she now lives back east in Virginia. When I was just a very new priest in my first assignment as the assistant pastor at Saint Mary's Parish in the Spokane Valley, Helen was a parishioner who began visiting with me on an occasional basis. She had some life-troubles at the time and I'm not so sure I was all that able to help her sort them out, but beyond that, we became fast friends. She probably was my senior by twenty years or so, but we connected and found that there was something pretty special in our relationship. (No, not *that* kind of "special!"). Rather, I guess it could be characterized much more as a Holy Spirit kind of *special*.

Helen had been very involved in the Charismatic movement with its deep emphasis on the working of the Holy Spirit in our daily lives and especially in beautiful, ecstatic forms of personal and communal prayer. She often spoke of her special "tongue" in which she praised God in words unknown to any other person. She was a person who sang her prayers and lived her deep personal faith in the real world without fear or shame.

For my part, the ecstatic kind of prayer that was so much a part of Helen's life never quite fit me. I guess I was (and remain) a more quiet kind of pray-er. But I learned so much from her and deeply appreciated what she taught me about faith in God and a personal relationship with Jesus. I suppose she learned from me, too; otherwise we would not have remained friends across so many decades and many thousands of miles of geographic separation.

My respect and love for Helen has not dimmed a bit through the years; though we now visit mostly through Facebook, she continues to inspire me by her witness to God's love, her freedom to pray in the Spirit whenever and however the Spirit so moves her, and most of all, her constant and indefatigable mission to see God everywhere and in everything and to share her joy in finding God with everyone.

Helen's feet are firmly set in God, her Father.

Helen's arms are securely wrapped around Jesus, her Lord and Brother.

Helen's heart is filled with the inextinguishable fire of the Holy Spirit, the great Love of her life.

On this grand Feast of Pentecost, I give thanks to God for the blessing of having a Spirit-friend like Helen...
