

A Word from Father

Dear Friends,

With the feast of Thanksgiving now in our rear view mirror and just the leftovers waiting to be used up in turkey sandwiches and soup, it is time to look ahead just a bit:



what's just ahead on the road, as we all know, is the season of Advent. Next weekend this season of wreaths, candles—violet and rose, and calendar countdowns to December 25th, begins! For us Christians, the First Sunday of Advent is also the first Sunday of our liturgical year; to mark this new year, we will move into the "B Cycle" of readings featuring Mark's version of Jesus' story as our Gospel reading through most of the coming year.

The First Sunday of Advent is also when bishops usually initiate liturgical changes in how we pray together as a church community. This year, Bishop Daly is asking the parishes of our diocese to make two such changes.

The first is a small rubric, but one that is meant to help us more reverently attend to the Real Presence of Christ in the consecrated bread and wine of the Eucharist. The change is simple: following the chanting of the Lamb of God, the congregation is now asked to reverently KNEEL in advance of the presentation of the consecrated elements and the proclamation by the presiding priest, "Behold the Lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world..."

The second is also a small change. Following the reception of Communion, the faithful are invited to return to their pews and either sit or kneel in private prayer and reflection on the mysteries they have just shared in. In other words, you do not have to wait for the presiding priest to sit or for the hymn to end to begin your personal meditation following reception of Holy Communion; sit or kneel as you wish.

Perhaps one of these "First Sundays of Advent" we will have the opportunity to begin using a revision of the revision of the English-language translation of the Mass. It has been five years since the most recent translation was initiated, and though we have largely gotten used to it, many of the prayers remain extremely clumsy, grammatically challenging, and quite unbeautiful. Pope Francis recently called on those who oversee such translations to consider more aspects to their work than just remaining strictly faithful to the Latin originals. Their translations should also be faithful to the grammar and structure of the language they are being translated into and to the poetic prayerfulness that should be part of the liturgy always. I don't think anyone is holding their breath that we will get that much needed "revision of the revision" any time soon, but we can always hope that our bishops, out of pastoral care for the people of God, might begin the hard work of preparing a translation into English that is dignified, inspiring, and prayerful.

Guard a tranquil spirit in these post-Thanksgiving days and even more in those of Advent to come!
