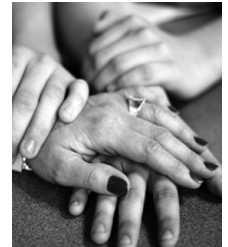
## BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY

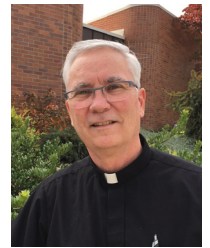

## A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

We all get plenty of catalogs in the mail, everything from clothing to computers is pitched to us in colorful pictures and promises of great savings. Mostly, I ignore them (except Costco!), but one came to me recently that intrigued me. It was from a travel agency that specializes in religious tours. This one was highlighting the world-renowned Passion Play of Oberammergau 2020 in Germany. The Passion Play would be the highlight of the trip, but there would also be many more days of travel in Italy, Europe, or the Holy Land, eleven or twelve days in all, flights and hotels included, for about \$5,000 each person, depending on choices made. The "chaplain" goes free...if he gets eight others to join him! (I don't have the catalog in front of me as I write this so I might have the details not quite right, but I can follow up on those if there is interest).

If you don't know about the Oberammergau Passion Play, do a quick search on the internet to find out why it is so special and a once-in-a-lifetime experience for many!
